Child Care Assistance

Your family may be eligible for Contra Costa Centre's **Child Care Financial Assistance Program**

The Contra Costa Centre Association helps provide financial assistance to parents who must place their children in a day care or after school setting while at work. The Centre does not have an onsite facility, however, the Centre does provide referrals to nearby child care providers. To qualify, a parent must meet the following criteria:

ole en	"The ability to get on a bike and ride, to get some fresh air and get away from the cubicle has saved me so many times," Jeffrey said. "The stress levels can build and if you can get out and go for a ride on the canal trail or the Iron Horse Trail, it can change your entire perspective."
it	Jeffrey has tried out the Segway but says it isn't for him. He occasionally rides the electric bike, especially on hot summer days when the heat is oppressive. He has co-workers who use the Green Fleet's hybrid car.

Without the Green Fleet, Jeffrey says he probably wouldn't use a bike. He lives in a hilly area where a bike isn't practical, plus he would have to supply and maintain his own bike, transport it to work and find somewhere to store it.

In fact, Jeffrey enjoys the Green Fleet so much that he pitches the program to new colleagues at the office

If the Contra Costa Centre awarded the equivalent of frequent flyer miles. Matt would be a platinum member. The El Cerrito resident hops on BART at a station near his house and when he reaches the MacArthur Station, he boards the new 15-minute Pleasant Hill/Contra Costa Centre Express. Riding BART cuts his commute to his job at the Contra Costa Transportation Authority in half, perhaps more on really bad traffic days.

Not only does Matt qualify for the Centre's transit subsidy, he also has access to its Green Fleet which includes a hybrid automobile. an electric bike, a Segway and a rack full of standard bicycles.

Matt makes frequent use of the Green Fleet. On Mondays, he takes a hybrid car to the grocery store and picks up lunches and snacks for the week. If he has doctor's appointment or has another errand that requires a car or a bike, he uses the Centre's easy on-line reservation system. He's never had to use the guaranteed ride home program but he's glad it is available. He says he widely promotes the Centre's transportation services around the office.



Rosa Angel loves the Solano Express.

"People tell me they can't take transit for this reason or that reason," Matt said, "But the Centre is trying to provide solutions for those reasons. I want people to know about their options."

For Rosa Angel, riding a Solano County Transit bus from her home in Benicia to her job at the Citrus Fresh Grill, located at Renaissance ClubSport in the Contra Costa Centre is a gift that keeps on giving.

It's cheaper and less stressful than driving, she says. The transit subsidy she receives from the Centre helps cut down on the cost even more. And she can use that 25-minute trip each way to catch up on her email, call family, catch

a little extra sleep or even put the finishing touches on her make-up on those days when she is running late.

What is the best part about commuting to work on the bus?

That's an easy question, Rosa said. Since she doesn't need a vehicle for work, she and her husband can more easily afford to help their daughters -- ages 15, 18 and 20 -- buy cars.

"A friend told me about the express bus service and I've been taking it for nine years now," Rosa said. "It's so convenient and I've never liked to drive anyway. I tell people about it all the time."

"I felt like a terrible mother." Heather said. "There was nothing in that store that I felt good about feeding my boys. I asked myself, 'Where is the convenience store for people like us who care about what they put in their bodies?' I went home that night and spent literally 12 hours researching the idea."

ENroute is a perfect addition to the Contra Costa Centre, Heather says.

Hops & Scotch owner Baldeep Sangha is designing just such a place at the corner of Treat Blvd. and Oak Road. Patrons will select among 40 to 50 locally distilled beers, taste some of the world's finest whiskey and learn from experts about what they are drinking.
